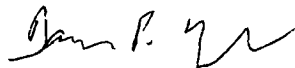
Dear Ms. Hallacy,

The City of Pittsburg has approved a low interest loan using a local CDBG revolving loan fund to Kendall Packaging Company located in Pittsburg, Kansas.

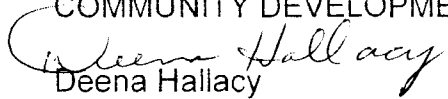
