**Plate 8**--Thin sections of mineral matter in coal. **A**, Intricate pattern of calcite in minute fractures in coal, under crossed nicols. Note cleavage and twinning in calcite (Mineral coal, X 125). **B**, Calcite filling fractures in coal (Mineral coal, X 125). **C**, Section shows distribution of minerals along banding in translucent attritus. Small opaque bodies are pyrite; lighter bodies consist largeley of clay minerals Notice the cube of pyrite in the upper right corner (Mineral coal, X 120).
